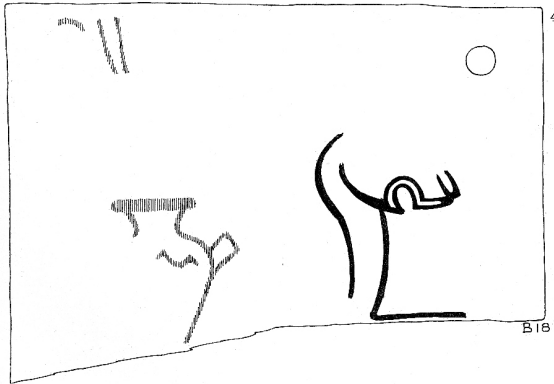

According to Regulski, the F4 hieroglyph is unrecognizable, because the black paint has vanished since its original publication.

Kahl 1994 attributes this to “(Narmer)”; Regulski dates this to “(Narmer-Aha)”.
