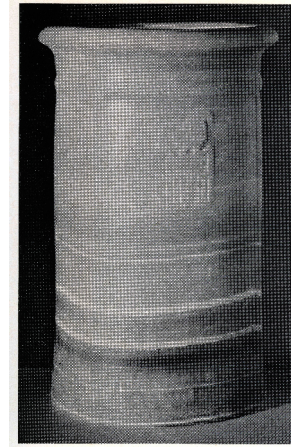
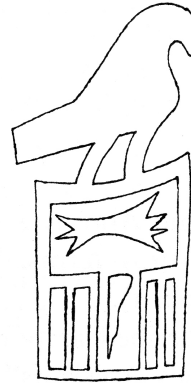
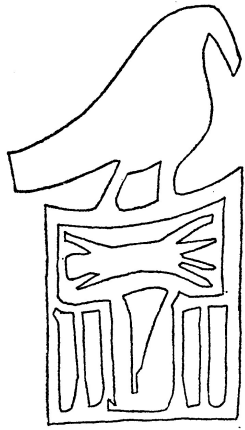

Comments

Harvey 1997 states that this object is "said to be from Amélineau's excavations at Abydos."

The image from Kaplony 1968 is likely to be more accurate than the one from Kaplony 1965a. The 1968 drawing shows a catfish with a typical tail, adipose and anal fin configuration. While the one from 1968 shows a pointed tail, which does not occur on any other Narmer *serekh*.
