Comments

This object was a surface find. The *serekh* on the pottery sherd was incised before firing (de Miroschedji & Sadek , 2000). De Miroschedji 2000, de Miroschedji and Sadek 2000, van den Brink and Braun 2003, and Pätznick 2009 attribute this inscription to Narmer. De Miroschedji and Sadeq 2005 say that the inscription is possibly Narmer.
