Comments

Amiran et al. 1983 mentions it only by including it in a list of Narmer inscriptions. They refer to the site as Lahav, the closest substantial town to the excavation. Van den Brink classifies it as Narmer(?). Pätznick (personal communication, 2017) does not see Narmer's name in this inscription. Seger et al. 1990 does not mention the inscription but discusses the site and excavation.
